My dear Mr. Reilly;

If you will have someone on your staff go through the attached sheets, I do not believe that the time will be wasted. I've gone through all of the dispatches on the Lindbergh case from the first break on and have briefed a few points that I think significant and which you may have overlooked.

I particularly call attention to the point of punctuation in the ransom notes.....

The damning matter of the three pins in the Jafsis testimony....

The matter of the sick Sealyham on the eve of the kidnapping...

I had extensive data on the ladder but you knocked that bit of evidence for a loop today in such telling fashion that there is no need for anything I might add. I have other matters briefed, too, on the case but don't want to take up my time or yours unless it is likely to help.

I admire the fight you are making and I think the case has been unfair. You've done a magnificent job against odds and you deserve the cooperation of anyone who can contribute anything to the cause.

I hope you can use the item included on Wilentz and his past connection with the case. I think it would be grand press.
