- (a) The Louise Rice point on the ransom note punctuation.
- (b) The damning matter of the three pins in the Jafsie testimony in the light of previous material on record about those pins....
- (c) The matter of the sick Scalyham on the eve of the kidnaping...
- (d) - the data on the previous connection of Wilentz with the case as ransom intermediary's attorney.

I am not a fan, I'm a professional fiction writer in good standing; but I've admired the splendid fight that you have made against odds in this case and have been very conscious of the frame-up aspects. I will be glad to be of any service that I can to you down here if there is anything that I can do. There is, of course, no question of remuneration in a case like this. I believe that the conviction of Hauptmann would be an outrage.

I have gone through all of the press matter on the case since the start and have a classified file. I had worked up a ladder report which your beautiful job of today makes useless - but the Johnson-Gow report is pretty good and there are many other telling facts that can be assembled on other points of the case from data in my file.
